## Art Theme Paper

Marina Abramović's piece is stunning. According to *Art21.org*, Marina Abramović was born in Belgrade, Yugoslavia in 1946. The second piece I chose was by the talented Glenn Ligon. Ligon's paintings and sculptures examine cultural and social identity through literature and photographs (Art21.org).
